PACKED LUNCH FROM THE HOTEL

We offer our guests the opportunity to prepare a packed lunch to bring on trips, at a cost of 75,- per meal.



Kjerag in Lysefjorden – the most majestic attraction of them all! Kjerag is a popular mountain range for hiking. Its most unique feature is the big boulder stuck tight between the mountain sides – known as Kjeragbolten. If you make your way up, you will be 1000 meters above Lysefjorden, with an amazing view!

Lysefjorden is 42 kilometers long and a gem of Norwegian nature. Glaciers from the last ice age shaped the wonderful fjord landscape you see today. The mountain towers a 1000 meters above sea level on both sides of the fjord. At some points the fjord is as deep as the mountain is tall!

The special characteristics of the fjord are intensified to the extreme by the Kjerag mountain. The steep mountain sides that tower above you are an impressive sight to behold from a boat deck. Naturally, Kjerag is a temptation for mountain climbers and base jumpers in summer.

The views in this fjord are spectacular.

Access:


By car; we recommend bringing the car on the ferry into Lysefjorden. From Egersund; follow RV 44 along Tengesdal to E-39, and then towards Ålgård. Make a right onto RV 45 Oltedalsvegen, and follow it until you get to RV 508 Seldalsvegen. Continue to RV 13 Lauviksvegen. Take the ferry to Lysebotnen and drive up to Ørneredet. Drive across Sirdal on your way back.

Or by car; drive from Egersund to Krossmoveien, and turn right onto E-39. Drive 3,6 km and make a left onto Sirdalsveien/42. 39 km to Tonstad. Follow Sirdalsveien for 47 km and make a left onto Lysevegen. Continue 10,5 km to Øygardsstølen, where you will find parking. 126 km in total. Approximately 2 hours and 13 minutes.

You will follow a marked trail from Øygardstøl. A roundtrip takes approximately four to six hours. The terrain is physically demanding. Parking at Øygardstøl costs 150,- per car, and 60,- per MC.

Remember hiking boots, proper clothing, packed lunches and drinks. The hike is demanding and suitable for experienced hikers and adults. Remember to check the weather forecast before you leave.

Please note: It is not possible to hike to Kjerag in winter. The hiking season is from the end of May/beginning of June to the middle/end of September.
